

Turn Into A Dirt Bag

Many luxury consumers would like to participate in green initiatives like composting, but do not want to want the inconvenience of a system that, well, stinks! If you're like me, you don't want to sacrifice

a clean fresh smelling kitchen for a smelly composter, no matter how good your eco-conscience is. I don't want a big ugly metal compost unit sitting on my nice tile floor, and I'm not willing to get into the whole worm thing either. There's a new innovative composter on the market that's grabbed my attention and is getting a lot of media play. It's small, can be hidden away in a cabinet, and won't kill my design sensibilities.

Before you wrinkle up your nose and imagine a composter stinking up your kitchen, think again.

NatureMill is an automatic indoor composter, check out <http://www.naturemill.com>. NatureMill fits right under your sink, or in any cabinet, and uses

very little energy, about the equivalent of a night-light. The composter features a powerful carbon filter that stops odors dead in their tracks. You can fill the NatureMill with up to 120 pounds of organic waste per month – veggies, coffee grounds, dairy, fish, paper, and any left-over food. There are no worms or bugs, the chamber mixes, heats and

aerates the compost, creating a rich fertilizer every 14 days – perfect for your garden. Prices start at \$299.00.



Manufacturers say: A Nature-Mill automatic composter recycles its weight in waste every 10 days, diverting over two tons of waste from landfills over its life. This reduces emissions of methane, a harmful greenhouse gas produced when organic matter

decomposes in oxygen-starved landfills. Compost returns nutrients to the environment, reducing our need for chemical fertilizers. NatureMill uses 5 kwh / month of energy - or about \$0.50/month - less than a garbage truck would burn in diesel fuel to haul the same waste. It is made from recycled and recyclable materials.
